Aaron Lynn Allmandinger	Army	2005-08	<p>The 22-year-old Mulberry native died in a house fire on September 11, 2008, at Fort Hood, Texas.</p> <p>Allmandinger entered the military in April 2005 as a cavalry scout, according to information from Fort Hood. He was assigned to the 1st Squadron, 7th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 1st Cavalry Division since August 2005, serving most recently as the squadron commander's gunner.</p> <p>During his time with the 1st Cavalry Division, Allmandinger deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom Rotation 06-08, earning the Combat Action Badge, two Army Commendation Medals, the Iraqi Campaign Medal with Campaign Star and the Global War on Terrorism Medal, among many others.</p> <p>While in Iraq, Allmandinger served in squadron's Charlie Troop and conducted patrols from Combat Outpost X-Ray in Taji, Iraq. During a large, well-organized enemy ambush in Falahat, Iraq, on Feb. 16, 2007, Allmandinger provided suppressive fire in support of his fellow Soldiers and was later awarded the Army Commendation Medal for his actions, which contributed to the survival of his squad.</p>
